WELCOME BACK

Another school year is fast approaching. Because schools must provide age-appropriate security against intruders while school is in session, controlled access is provided to the student occupants of our buildings. Please make it a point to find out which doors in your child's building are open and at what times. We wish to make our buildings inviting while safeguarding the safety of our students. Also, if you would like information concerning the rental of any of our facilities, please consult the appropriate building principal.

EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Upper Sandusky EV Schools will provide equal opportunities for employment, retention, and advancement of all people regardless of race, color, creed, national origin, citizenship status, political affiliation, age, sex, or handicap.

COMPREHENSIVE CRISIS INTERVENTION

The Board of Education believes that the employees and students of the District, as well as visitors, are entitled to function in a safe and drug-free school environment. In this regard, the Board has adopted policies related to conduct in the school setting as well as those that address various crisis situations. PROHIBITION AGAINST HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION, BULLYING

Harassment, intimidation, or bullying behavior by any student / school personnel in the Upper Sandusky EV School District is strictly prohibited, and such conduct may result in disciplinary action, including suspension and/or expulsion from school. "Harassment, intimidation, or bullying," in accordance with House Bill 276, means any intentional written, verbal, graphic or physical act, including electronically transmitted acts i.e., Internet, cell phone, personal digital assistant (PDA), or wireless hand-held device, either overt or covert, by a student or group of students toward other students / school personnel with the intent to harass, intimidate, injure, threaten, ridicule, or humiliate. Such behaviors are prohibited on or immediately adjacent to school grounds, at any school-sponsored activity, on school-provided transportation, or at any official school bus stop that a reasonable person under the circumstances should know will have the effect of:

- A. causing mental or physical harm to the other student / school personnel, including placing an individual in reasonable fear of physical harm and / or damaging of student(s)' personal property; and / or
- B. being sufficiently severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates an intimidating, threatening, or abusive educational environment for the other student / school personnel.

THREE YEAR ASBESTOS INSPECTION - Upper Sandusky Exempted Village Schools, Spring 2009

The Upper Sandusky School buildings were inspected this summer for asbestos-containing building materials with the following results:

All of the known asbestos-containing materials have been inspected and found to be in good condition. No new asbestos-containing materials were found, but the terrazo floor, carpet mastic, ceramic tile grout, and some of the hard plaster are suspect materials. Before any of these materials are disturbed, they need to be tested. All buildings within the district containing asbestos were found to be clean and in good repair. A copy of the inspection can be obtained from the central office.

STUDENT ABSENCES

We request that parents call the school as soon as possible if they know a child is going to be absent from school on a given day. Early notification of student absences assists us with communications to teachers and facilitates to obtain make-up work and the like. Such notification helps us safeguard the best interests of children in terms of their welfare, safety, and education.

AHTLETIC DELAYS

When school is closed due to weather, evening sports contests are sometimes held if the weather conditions subside during the day. Therefore, decisions about evening events are usually made sometime after 1:00 p.m., and announcements are broadcast over the local television station at WRAM TV 22.

FOOD SERVICE INFORMATION

All meals served must meet nutritional standards established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Free and reduced-price lunch forms will be passed out the first day of school. All parents are asked to complete and return this form to the proper school within the first couple days so that we might better serve the needs of all concerned. Many of the students in grades 7-12 qualify for these lunches but fail to complete and return these forms. We cannot approve an application that is not complete. We ask that these forms be returned by every eligible student because failure to do so affects our eligibility for funding in other school program areas – especially our Title programs which serve the educational needs of many of our students.

IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Children attending a day care, pre-school, or a head start center located in a school are required to have the following:

Four doses of DTaP, DTP, DT, in any combination (with a fifth dose required if the fourth dose was administered prior to the student's fourth birthday)

Three doses of OPV or IPV

Two doses of measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine

Three or four doses of haemophilus b vaccine

Three doses of hepatitis B vaccine

The requirements for students in grades Kindergarten through 12th are as follows:

All kindergarten students must have evidence of having received two doses of MMR vaccine. This requirement will be progressive.

All kindergarten (only) students are required to have a fifth dose of DTaP/DTP/DT vaccine if the fourth dose was administered prior to the fourth birthday.

All kindergarten students are required to have a fourth dose of polio vaccine if the third dose was administered prior to the fourth birthday.

All kindergarten students are required to have three doses of hepatitis B vaccine. This requirement will be progressive.

All kindergarten students are required to have a varicella vaccine.

All students in the first grade are required to have two doses of MMR and three doses of hepatitis B vaccine.

All students in grades 7 through 12 are required to have two doses of MMR vaccine unless otherwise exempt.

If your child needs any of the above shots, please schedule to have this done prior to the first day of school.

MEDICATIONS

Any medication sent to school must be accompanied by a school medication form which must be filled out and signed by the doctor and also by the parent. The medication container must be labeled by the pharmacist as to the directions given by the doctor, even if it is an over-the-counter medication. Students needing to carry inhalers or bee sting kits must have the form filled out by the doctor stating that the child needs to have it available at all times and is capable of administering it his/her self.

If this procedure is not followed, we will call you and you will have to come and give your child his/her medication. This is for your child's protection and for our assurance the medication is for your child.

Students needing an inhaler can carry them and use as directed when needed. A medication form, filled out by the doctor, needs to be on file in the school office. If you have any questions, please feel free to call your child's school office.

SMOKE FREE FACILITIES AND GROUNDS

In compliance with the law, Upper Sandusky E.V. Schools is a smoke-free facility. We ask that all district residents respect this fact while on school grounds and/or in, on, or around school facilities/perchery.

BUS REGULATIONS

All students are to ride on their assigned bus. Students must leave or board the bus at locations to which they have been assigned, unless they have parental and administrative authorization to do otherwise.

Riding school buses is a privilege and a convenience; it is NOT a right. The board authorizes the superintendent and other administrative personnel to suspend, if necessary, a student's bus riding privileges. Inappropriate language and/or conduct will be sufficient reason for refusing transportation service to any student. Whenever it becomes necessary to refuse a student transportation, the school authorities shall notify the parents in writing or by phone of such refusal with a full explanation. Until such time as the school authorities have received assurance from the parents of future good conduct on the part of the student, the student shall not be permitted to ride the bus.

Students waiting for a late bus are not permitted to leave school grounds except by bus. Unless the parent or guardian himself/herself is handicapped and unable to do so, Pre-school children being transported have to be placed on and taken off of the bus by a parent or guardian. The bus driver cannot leave his/her seat to put the child in the seat or harness.

Once students depart their assigned stops, they are expected to report directly to their home. District responsibility ends when the student is delivered to the regular bus stop after the close of the school day. Your child can be expected anytime at home in the evening after the school bell rings.

The following regulations pertain to school bus conduct and are intended to ensure the safety and welfare of the students, the bus driver, and other drivers on the road and to ensure the safety and proper maintenance of school buses.

PLEASE BE ON TIME and arrive at the bus stop before the bus is scheduled to arrive. Bus drivers are not required to wait on students who are not punctual.

NEVER CROSS in front of the bus until the driver signals for you to do so.

STAY OFF THE ROAD, even when you see the bus coming. Students should wait in a location clear of traffic and away from the stop (designated area). Stand back until the bus stops completely and the door opens before you move to get on.

BE CAREFUL in approaching bus stops. Walk facing oncoming traffic. Be sure the road is clear both ways before crossing roads and highways.

STAY SEATED until the bus stops and the door opens. Let people closest to the front get off first.

SIT DOWN right away and put down your books, etc., before the bus starts. Sit in your assigned seats. Bus drivers have the right to assign students to a seat and to expect reasonable conduct (similar to classroom conduct) from them. Obey the driver promptly and respectfully or run the risk of losing bus riding privileges.

USE HANDRAIL and take the steps one at a time as you get on.

ACT THE WAY YOU WOULD IN CLASS – no loud talking, fooling around, throwing things, provoking or disturbing others. Reach your assigned seat without disturbing or crowding other students and always remain seated while the bus is moving.

NEVER stick your head, arms, hands, or anything out the window. Don't open any windows without the driver's permission.

GET OFF QUICKLY AND QUIETLY, without pushing or running. Remain seated until the bus stops to unload and wait for the signal from the bus driver before crossing the road in front of the bus.

SAVE SNACKS for later. Keep the bus clean and sanitary. No chewing gum, candy, soft drinks, etc. are permitted.

TAKE ALL your books, clothes, and bundles and remember to leave the bus as clean as you found it. Treat bus seats and equipment as you would a valuable piece of home furniture. Report all damages to bus seats, intentional or otherwise, to the bus driver.

IN AN EMERGENCY, wait for the driver to give instructions.

OTHER REGULATIONS will be established by the driver.

If you have questions or problems regarding the transportation of your child, please contact Mrs. Kim Graboski, Transportation Director, at 419-294-1952.

Remember, any time your child needs dropped off at a location other than their normal drop-off point, they MUST have a note signed by their parent with all the pertinent information included. This bussing change will then be approved by the office staff, who in turn will notify the bus drivers.

ACCESS TO STUDENT RECORDS

The Family Educational Right and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("adult students" or "eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's educational records. Since this policy is very detailed, depending upon the person or group who might be requesting such records, any inquiries concerning the school's release of records or their policies may be directed to the superintendent's office (419) 294-2306.

"Let's Do Lunch and Breakfast"

Just a reminder that students will be able to put money "on account" as we start the school year with the Meals Plus point of sale system. This was implemented at the end of last school year at USHS.

Students will be able to put cash or checks "on account" starting the first day of school. Cashiers will report your balance each day as you purchase lunch or other items on the line drawing from your account. Students will, however, still be able to pay for their lunch or a la carte items each day as in the past. You do not have to put money on account. It is simply an option for your convenience.

Also, breakfast will be available each morning starting at 7:30 a.m. Students who are eligible for a free lunch are also eligible for a free breakfast. Students who are eligible for a reduced priced lunch are eligible for a reduced priced breakfast of \$.30. Breakfast cost for other students is \$1.00. Items such as juice, milk, pop tarts, fruit, etc. will also be available separately.

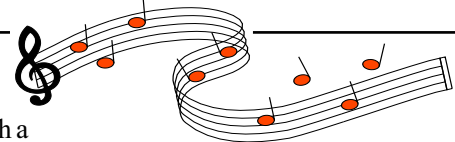
